Newslink Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is Newslink?

Newslink is an online archival news information service that allows access to SPH Media newspapers dating back to 1989.

2. How can I access Newslink?

NLB patrons can access Newslink online via NLB's eResources website.

Login using your NLB myLibrary username.

To sign up for library membership with your SingPass, myLibrary username, or check your username / password, please go to <u>account.nlb.gov.sg</u>.

3. What are the newspaper titles currently archived in Newslink?

The newspapers archived in Newslink are:

4. What information is archived in Newslink?

Newslink archives SPH Media's news content. All news stories and information written by SPH Media journalists and published in the newspapers under # 3 are archived.

However, classified advertisements, television listings, cinema movie session schedules, company announcements, tenders & notices, obituaries and special marketing supplements are not archived in Newslink.

Do note also that there are some public holidays when SPH Media newspapers are not published eg: The Straits Times is not published on Boxing Day.

5. What is the archival period of the newspapers available in Newslink, and how regularly do they get updated?

Newslink offers archived SPH Media content from 1989 to present. Users are able to read the full text articles.

Refer to # 10 below should the PDF of the article be required.

Newspaper articles are updated in the system one day after publication for weekdays. For weekends, articles are normally updated on Tuesday or Wednesday.

6. What other types of content can I access from Newslink?

Other than newspaper articles, users can also view images. All accompanying images archived in Newslink are thumbnails that cannot be enlarged to full-size due to copyright.

Refer to # 10 should the user wish to get the full size image.

7. Do I have access to third party content eg: newswires from Reuters, AFP etc via Newslink?

No. Third party content (e.g. news wires from Reuters, AFP, etc) published in SPH Media's newspapers are <u>not</u> available in Newslink.

8. Why can't I access Newslink even though I have logged in using myLibrary credentials?



NLB's Newslink subscription is limited to 80 concurrent access. If you see the message above, the access has reached its maximum concurrency limit. Please try to access later.
